Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

Axiom Diversified Monthly Income Portfolio's (referred to as the *Portfolio*) portfolio advisor is CIBC Asset Management Inc. (referred to as *CAMI*, the *Manager* or the *Portfolio Advisor*). The Portfolio invests in units of various CIBC Private Pools (formerly *Renaissance Private Pools*) (referred to individually, as an *Underlying Fund* and, collectively, as the *Underlying Funds*) which can be found in the Top Positions table of the Summary of Investment Portfolio.

The commentary that follows provides a summary of the results of operations for the six-month period ended February 28, 2023. All dollar figures are expressed in thousands, unless otherwise indicated.

The Portfolio's net asset value decreased by 4% during the period, from \$92,636 as at August 31, 2022 to \$88,947 as at February 28, 2023. Net redemptions of \$5,279 in the period, which included purchases of \$135,650 due to rebalancing of a portfolio product that holds units of the Portfolio, were partially offset by positive investment performance, resulting in an overall decrease in net asset value.

Class A units of the Portfolio posted a return of 2.0% for the period. The Portfolio's primary benchmarks, the FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index and the S&P/TSX Composite Dividend Index (referred to as the *primary benchmarks*), returned 0.6% and 5.5%, respectively, for the same period. The Portfolio's blended benchmark (referred to as the *blended benchmark*) comprises 40% FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index, 36.6% S&P/TSX Composite Dividend Index, 18.4% S&P/TSX Composite Index and 5% S&P 500 Index. The blended benchmark returned 3.7% for the same period. The blended benchmark closely reflects the asset classes in which the Portfolio invests, and is designed to provide a more useful comparative to the Portfolio's performance. The Portfolio's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, unlike the primary and blended benchmarks' returns. See the section *Past Performance* for the returns of other classes of units offered by the Portfolio.

The Portfolio has a target asset allocation of 40% Canadian fixed income securities, 36.6% Canadian income-generating investments, 18.4% Canadian equities and 5% U.S. equities.

Bond yields rose over the past six months as inflationary pressures dominated the market, with concerns that elevated inflation levels would become entrenched in the economy. Globally, central banks aggressively raised interest rates and reduced their respective balance sheets in order to cool demand and bring inflation back within their target ranges. The Canadian yield curve, representing the difference in yield between the 30-year bond and the two-year bond, inverted further during the period. Global bond markets continued to price in increased risks of a central bank policy error and a heightened probability of a recession.

Despite the increase in interest rates, corporate bonds outperformed as yields reached attractive levels and investors believed central banks were getting close to the end of their monetary tightening cycles. This also reflected inflation cooling from the peak levels experienced in the summer of 2022.

Financial market volatility accelerated late in the month when the U.K. announced a generous fiscal policy (leading to large deficits). Smaller-capitalization companies underperformed.

During the fourth quarter of 2022, inflation data came in lower than expected. With the prospect of inflation having peaked, expectations of more accommodative monetary policy led to equity market gains. Over the fourth quarter, market leadership reflected the improved sentiment, as cyclical sectors outperformed more defensive sectors and small-capitalization companies outperformed their large-capitalization peers.

The Canadian equity market delivered a small gain over the six-month period amid signs that the aggressive interest-rate increases by global central banks were nearing an end. The interest-rate increases were made to combat high post-pandemic inflation rates. Inflation began to ease largely as a result of lower crude oil prices. There was considerable divergence in underlying sector performance during the period, with some of the most negatively impacted sectors of 2022 posting strong recoveries. The information technology sector, for example, rose by approximately 20% versus a decline of over 50% during the prior six-month period. In contrast, the energy sector declined by approximately 3%.

In February, U.S. stocks lost some of their gains as a result of continued elevated inflation and the possibility of higher-than-expected interest-rate increases by central banks. In general, U.S. equities performed relatively well during this volatile period, although defensive sectors of the market underperformed.

CIBC Equity Income Private Pool (*formerly Renaissance Equity Income Private Pool*) was the most significant detractor from the Portfolio's performance, followed by CIBC Canadian Equity Private Pool (*formerly Renaissance Canadian Equity Private Pool*) and CIBC U.S. Equity Private Pool (*formerly Renaissance U.S. Equity Private Pool*).

CIBC Canadian Fixed Income Private Pool (*formerly Renaissance Canadian Fixed Income Private Pool*) was the contributor to the Portfolio's performance.

Recent Developments

Effective April 27, 2023, Bryan Houston is appointed Chair of the Independent Review Committee.

The COVID-19 pandemic and the Russia-Ukraine war have disrupted the global economy and financial markets in unprecedented and unpredictable ways. This has resulted in significant volatility and uncertainty in financial markets. It is unclear what further actions may be taken by governments and the resulting impact on global economies, businesses and financial markets. Inflation has increased in many markets across the globe, leading central banks to raise interest rates in order to counter rapidly rising prices. These factors may adversely affect the performance of the Portfolio. The Manager continues to monitor ongoing developments and the impact to investment strategies.

Related Party Transactions

Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce (referred to as *CIBC*) and its affiliates have the following roles and responsibilities with respect to the Portfolio, and receive the fees described below in connection with their roles and responsibilities.

Manager, Trustee, and Portfolio Advisor of the Portfolio

CAMI, a wholly-owned subsidiary of CIBC, is the Portfolio's Manager, Trustee, and Portfolio Advisor. As Manager, CAMI receives management fees with respect to the Portfolio's day-to-day business and operations, calculated based on the net asset value of each respective class of units of the Portfolio as described in *Management Fees*.

The Manager pays the Portfolio's operating expenses (other than certain fund costs) in respect of the classes of units of the Portfolios, which may include but are not limited to, operating and administrative costs; regulatory fees; audit, and legal fees and expenses; trustee, safekeeping, custodial, and any agency fees; and investor servicing costs and costs of unitholder reports, prospectuses, Fund Facts, and other reports, in exchange for the Portfolio paying a fixed rate administration fee (plus applicable GST/HST) to the Manager with respect to those classes of units. The fixed administration fee payable by the Portfolio, may, in any particular period, exceed or be lower than the expenses we incur in providing such services to the Portfolio.

As Trustee, CAMI holds title to the Portfolio's property (cash and securities) on behalf of its unitholders. As Portfolio Advisor, CAMI provides, or arranges to provide for, investment advice and portfolio management services to the Portfolio. CAMI also compensates dealers in connection with their marketing activities regarding the Portfolio. From time to time, CAMI may invest in units of the Portfolio.

Distributor

Dealers and other firms sell units of the Portfolio to investors. These dealers and other firms include CAMI's related dealers such as the CIBC Investor's Edge discount brokerage division of CIBC Investor Services Inc. (referred to as *CIBC ISI*), the CIBC Imperial Service division of CIBC ISI, and the CIBC Wood Gundy division of CIBC World Markets Inc. (referred to as *CIBC WM*). CIBC ISI and CIBC WM are wholly-owned subsidiaries of CIBC.

CAMI may pay sales commissions and trailing commissions to these dealers and firms in connection with the sale of units of the Portfolio. These dealers and other firms may pay a portion of these sales commissions and trailing commissions to their advisors who sell units of the Portfolio to investors.

Portfolio Transactions

The Portfolio may undertake currency and currency derivative transactions where CIBC WM, CIBC World Markets Corp., or any affiliate of CIBC is the counterparty (referred to as the *Related Party Transactions*) in reliance on the standing instructions issued by the Independent Review Committee (referred to as the *IRC*).

At least annually, the IRC reviews the Related Party Transactions for which they have issued standing instructions. The IRC is required to advise the Canadian securities regulatory authorities, after a matter has been referred to or reported to it by the Manager, if it determines that an investment decision was not made in accordance with conditions imposed by securities legislation or the IRC in any Related Party Transactions requiring its approval.

Custodian

CIBC Mellon Trust Company is the custodian of the Portfolio (referred to as the *Custodian*). The Custodian holds cash and securities for the Portfolio and ensures that those assets are kept separate from any other cash or securities that the Custodian might be holding. The Custodian also provides other services to the Portfolio including record-keeping and processing foreign exchange transactions. The fees and spreads for services of the Custodian are paid by the Manager. CIBC owns a 50% interest in the Custodian.

Service Provider

CIBC Mellon Global Securities Services Company (referred to as *CIBC GSS*) provides certain services to the Portfolio, including fund accounting and reporting, and portfolio valuation. Such servicing fees are paid by the Manager. CIBC indirectly owns a 50% interest in CIBC GSS.

⁸ The portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the portfolio advisor manages the portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to a fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by a fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

Management Fees

The Portfolio pays CAMI an annual management fee to cover the costs of managing the Portfolio. Management fees are based on the Portfolio's net asset value and are calculated daily and paid monthly. Management fees are paid to CAMI in consideration for providing, or arranging for the provision of, management, distribution, and portfolio advisory services. Advertising and promotional expenses, office overhead expenses related to the Manager's activities, and trailing commissions are paid by CAMI out of the management fees received from the Portfolio. The Portfolio is required to pay applicable taxes on the management fees paid to CAMI. Refer to the simplified prospectus for the annual management fee rate for each class of units. No management fees or incentive fees are payable by the Portfolio that, to a reasonable person, would duplicate a fee payable by an Underlying Fund for the same service.

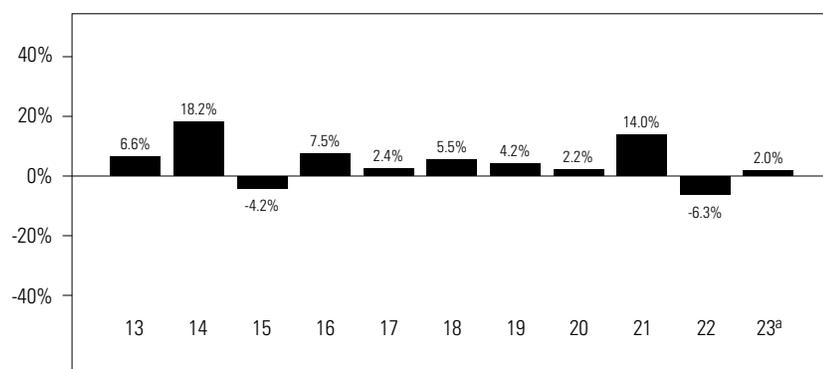

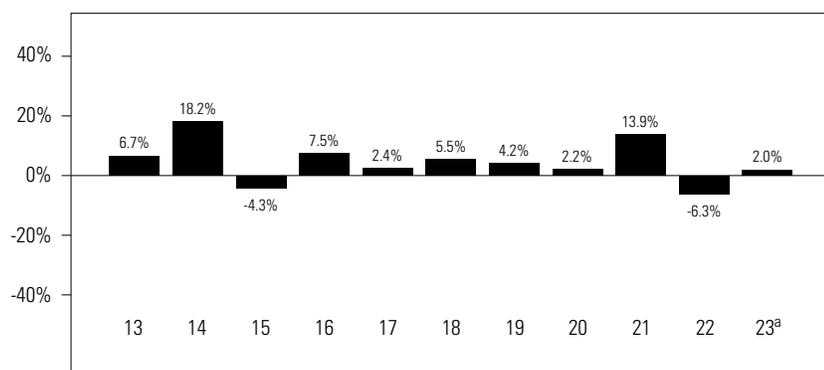
Class A Units

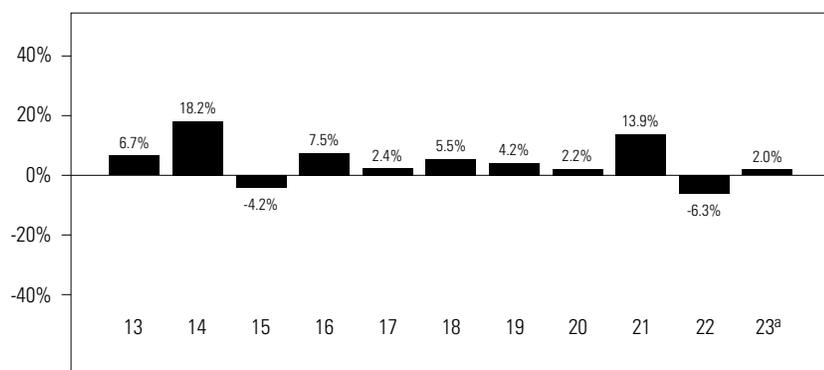
Axiom Diversified Monthly Income Portfolio

Class T6 Units



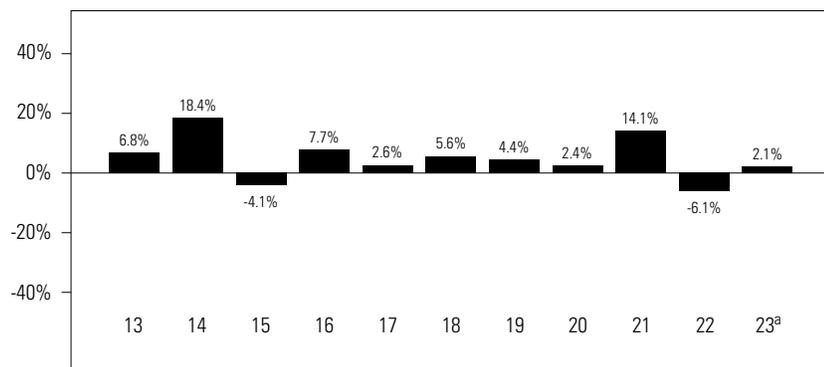

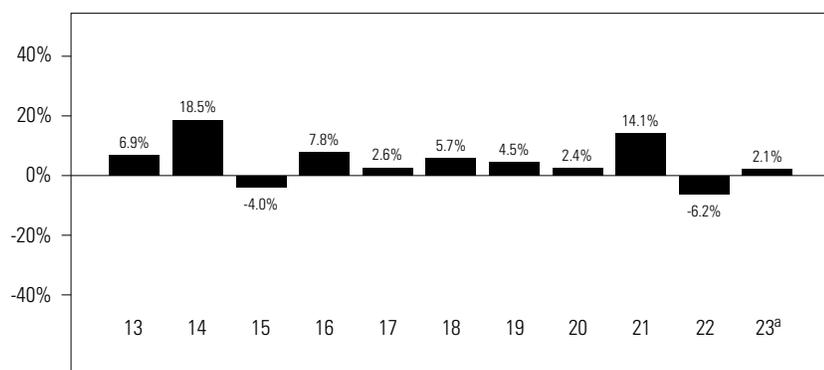

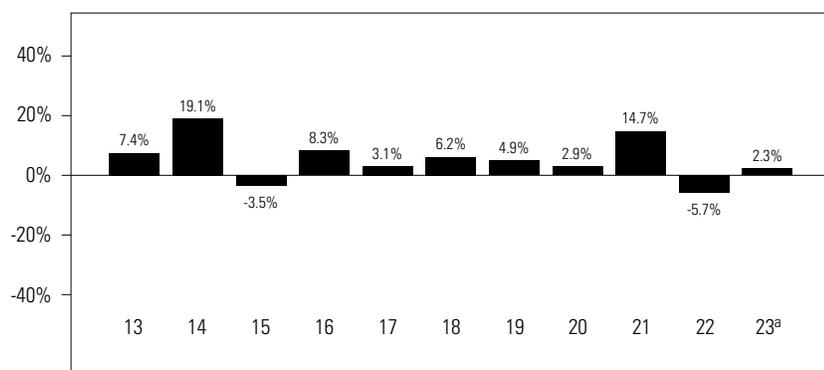
Axiom Diversified Monthly Income Portfolio

Select-T6 Class Units



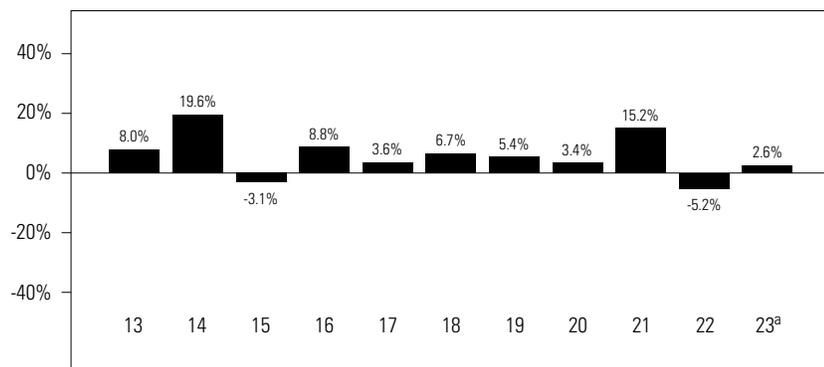

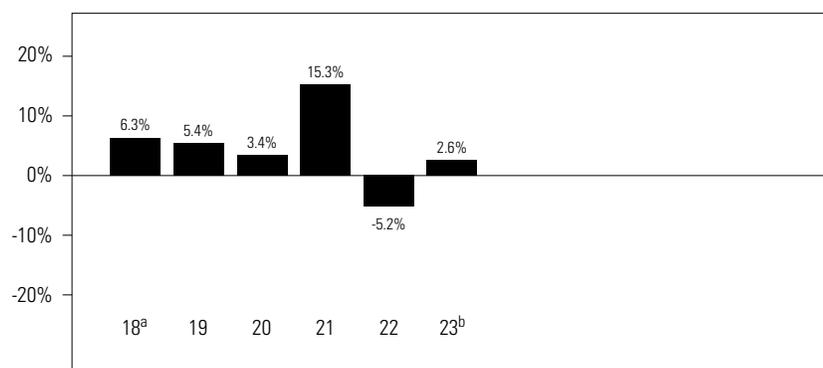
Class F Units
